HEAD LICE POLICY

Each camper will be examined for head lice and illness (fever) upon arrival. If nits or lice are present, campers will be turned away with no refunds issued. If a camper is sent home, the camp is not responsible for expenses incurred in picking up the camper.

We want your time at camp to be a pleasant and enjoyable experience, so please take the following precautionary measures to see that your camper is ready for the total camp experience:

1. Parents should do a head lice check on their children two weeks before camp.
2. Group Leaders should do a head lice check of the group on the day of departure to make sure no one in the group is infested.

We have provided the following information to help you in your head lice checks and to provide you with materials for informing parents of our policy concerning head lice.

What are they?

Head lice are small grayish-white insects, which are found in the hair, behind the ears, and on the nape of the neck. They live on human blood and their bites cause itching and scratching. These bites can lead to infection.

How can they be recognized?

The adult louse is about the size of a sesame seed. They attach their eggs (called nits) to strands of hair close to the scalp. Nits are tiny, pearl gray, oval shaped specks that are attached firmly to the hair. These may hatch in 1 week, but have been known to survive for 10 days. Frequent scratching of the head is usually the first clue of infestation.

How long does it take from exposure to infestation?

One to two weeks.

When are they contagious?

As long as there are live lice and eggs.

How are they spread?

They are spread from direct contact with an infested person or from personal items of the infested person such as combs, brushes, pillows, bedding, clothing, head coverings, or furniture. Since they need a human scalp for food and warmth, the louse dies when away from the human body for 48 hours.

CAMP POLICIES

Check-in: Registration and **check in at 1:00pm.** All campers must complete health check and receive dorm assignments before settling in. Please have contracted payment balance ready for turn in on arrival.

Departure time: 3PM

Health Check: All guests will be screened for fever and head lice upon arrival. Please pre-screen your campers before departing for camp to avoid campers being turned away at registration.

Parking: All vehicles must be parked in the designated parking area. Please do not drive vehicles through camp.

Linens: Campers must furnish their own bedding, pillows, and towels. Bunks are twin size. Camp is not responsible for any lost or abandoned items at camp.

Payment: Payment is due upon arrival. Any damages must be paid for before departure.

Legal Waiver: All Guests must complete the registration information and sign waivers before the deadline.

Waterfront Activities:

- Waterfront activities are allowed only when Lifeguard is on duty.
- Life jackets must be worn at all times for any lake activity - no matter the age or skill level.
- Leaders must be present at the waterfront when any minors are at water activities.
- Anyone failing to comply with rules of the Camp and applicable State laws shall be denied water activities.
- Certain activities such as suspended waterslide, kayaking, and Banana Boat rides are restricted to campers age 10 and over.

Security: Camp gates are locked after registration to keep a secure campground and monitor in and out traffic. If a guest needs to leave early please notify camp staff. We are not able to accommodate late arrivals, early departures, or visits from any outside guests while camp is in session. For emergency early check outs please contact the camp via email/voicemail to allow us to await your arrival.

Camper Age: Summer camp is for campers age 6-12. Campers must be able to use the restroom and shower completely on their own and be old enough to sleep on their own in their own bed.

Food: Typically, personal snacks are not needed because we eat well in the dining hall. Yet, if still brought, there are not snacks allowed in the dorms. We provide water coolers at every activity and refillable sport water bottles for camp counselors to hydrate campers. For food allergies please contact the camp beforehand. If bringing personal food, it must be pre-prepped and not be a burden on camp staff or group leaders.

Dress: SHOES MUST BE WORN AT ALL TIMES. For safety reasons water shoes must be worn in the lake while swimming. Flip-flops are not adequate and will not stay on in the soft lake bottom. All guests must dress in keeping with modesty and Christian ideals. Please encourage campers to wear a coverup and have modest swim attire.

Restrictions:

- No alcoholic beverages, tobacco, narcotics, vapes or illegal drugs of any kind are permitted on the Campgrounds.
- Over-the-counter and prescription drugs must be sent in their original container and must be kept out of reach of children in the First Aid station. Group Leaders will be responsible for administering medication to campers in their group.
- All profanity, immoral conduct of any nature, and immodest dress are not allowed at Camp His Way.
- Males and females must not visit each other's dorms.
- No pranks of any sort.

First Aid: First aid and emergency care will be available. The First Aid station is located by the Camp Office. Emergency procedures are posted. Camp Staff should be notified of any emergency. We are in a rural location and hospitals are over 30 miles away.

Phones & Internet: Landline phones are only available for emergency use. We have password protected Wi-Fi available to share only with group leaders.

Device Usage: Camp is an "unplugged" summer camp. Campers are not allowed to bring any wi-fi/cellular enabled device or tablet/phone/smart watches of any sort. Anything brought to camp will be held by camp staff until dismissal.
